From the ACCS President

Dear ACCS members,

Greetings! In a week or so, we will gather together once again at the National Communication Association annual conference in Dallas, Texas, to present papers, share research insights, catch up with one another, and celebrate another year of growth and achievements! This year's theme at NCA is "Our Legacy, Our Relevance." I'd like to briefly report to you what we have done to build on our legacy established by former ACCS presidents and officers, and make our service relevant to our ACCS members.

First, ACCS membership has continued to grow. We have new members joining us and returning members renew membership almost every month. In particular, we have a record number of members that paid 5-year membership dues. Such continued commitment and support have been instrumental in bettering our service to the ACCS community.

Second, we have continued to attract donations from friends of ACCS. This year, we received a generous donation of \$10,000 from Dr. Xiao Xiaosui, Professor of Communication at Hong Kong Baptist University. Per his request, the ACCS will establish Xiao-Wu Scholarship Fund to promote the study of rhetorical communication.

Third, we have extended our collaboration with other academic organizations and are achieving greater reputation and visibility in both the U.S. and East Asia. Besides collaborating with CCA to review, select, and panel presentations for the NCA annual conference, we are one of the organizers for an ICA post-conference in Prague, Czech Republic. We have been approached by more than one Chinese communication journal that seeks collaboration with them. Professor Guoming-Chen, founding president of ACCS, is currently working with CCA and other communication associations to plan a Pan-Asian communication conference in Asia.

Fourth, we have extended our platform for academic and intellectual exchange beyond the annual meeting at NCA and English social media such as Facebook and Twitter. Besides a new email listserve that sends out monthly news digest and biannual newsletters, we have conducted a series of virtual brownbag sessions on WeChat (a popular mobile messaging app

in Greater China) that have attracted over 300 communication scholars since June 2017. Given the increasing popularity of this new platform, we will continue to host more virtual brownbag sessions and cover a broader range of topics in the 2017-18 academic year.

Fifth, this year, the ACCS is giving out two new awards: an outstanding thesis/dissertation award and an early career award. Members of the research committee have already reviewed nominations and made selections. They will be announced at the NCA conference in Dallas, Texas and will inspire the ACCS members to continue producing top-notch research related to Chinese communication studies.

None of these achievements would have been possible without the enthusiastic support and hard work of all the ACCS officers.
